NOTICE FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF NATIONAL OBSERVERS FOR THE BLUEFIN TUNAFISHING CAMPAIGN MALTA 2023

The company Oceanis srl has a multiannual experience in developing activities related to the management of fishery resources, dealing with training, monitoring, development, and research; with a particular interest on large pelagic species. Since 2010 it has been providing training and deployments management of National Observers for the Bluefin tuna fishing campaign.

Coordination and technical support in the management of NOs are managed by the consortium between the OCEANIS srl and COFREPECHE s.a.. The consortium carries out activities of recruiting and training in order to fulfill the specific tasks established within the ICCAT Recommendation 21/08. Moreover, the Consortium provides for the purchase of equipment and the deployment of observers on vessels towing the cages with live BFT from the catching areas to the fattening facilities (farms). The recruitment activity is under the supervision of the Scientific Coordinator.

The following are the minimum requirements for working as an NOs:

- 1. Have a minimum of experience at sea
- Successfully complete the training course and have acquired the technical education prescribed byICCAT regulations
- 3. Be certified by a registered medical practitioner to be physically fit to work on board.
- 4. Ability to live in confined accommodation, ability to adapt to life on board
- 5. Be able to work independently, following technical instructions
- 6. Respect and aptitude for integration with people of different religions and/or nationalities
- 7. Suitability for swimming and rowing
- 8. Absence of criminal record (POLICE CONDUCT CERTIFICATE)
- 9. VAT Number





If one is currently undergoing, or for the most part has completed, a course of study related to marine science, it counts as an academic qualification that contributes to the enhancement of the individual's work and training experience in the area of marine monitoring programs. Furthermore, possession of the STCW'95 certificate has a positive connotation, so it is sufficient but not necessary, Oceanis can provide to STCW''95 Basic thanks to ISTC College, the certificate is free for the National Observer who will be deployed on board.

Applicants must be available for:

- a 5-day training session (second half of April)
- The work deployment on TUGs or at the port of disembarkation
- The work period is approximately 30 to 60 days, starting approximately from 15th May. The period depends on the marine weather conditions and the success of the fishing activity.
- A 1- or 2-day briefing (before deployment)
- A 1-day debriefing (after deployment)
- The daily pay is EUR 127.19 net per day.
